*Violence Transformed* began in 2007 as a modest effort to draw attention to the power of art, artists and art making to transform our collective experience with violence. The result was a stunning exhibit at the Massachusetts Statehouse curated by members of diverse arts, education and community service organizations and highlighted by an unforgettable evening of live performances. More than 3,000 children, families, students, legislators and their constituents visited the exhibit or attended the opening event. In 2008 and 2009, the organizers and co-curators of *Violence Transformed* came together again and took the project beyond the Statehouse, launching new exhibitions in at a variety of venues.

*Violence Transformed 2010* will again entail significant expansion. In addition to the Statehouse exhibit, highlights of *Violence 2010* calendar will include: *"The Energy of Ubuntu: Youth Transforming Violence"*, collaborative works by area youth at Wheelock College's Towne Gallery; selected works at the *Children's Hospital Day of Remembrance*; an exhibition of works curated by the *Teen Curators of Urbano* (a new Jamaica Plains venue); *"Violence Transformed: The Artist's Voice"*, works by community and SMFA-affiliated artists at the Resnikoff Gallery of Roxbury Community College; and a two-week long exhibition of works by artists of the *Combat Paper Project* at Harvard University's Guttman Library.
